GA Housing program changes

- 80-day housing limit effective from 7/1/2024 through 6/30/2025
 - Does not include AWC nights (12/1/2024 through 3/31/2025)
- 1,100 rooms per night cap (statewide)
 - 9/15/2024 through 11/30/2024 &
 - 4/1/2025 thought 6/30/2025



GA Housing program changes

- Housing search requirement (tasks)
- Income contribution
- Shelter first referral
- 6/30/2023 Cohort eligibility ended 7/1/2024
- Household must call ESD to renew
- Emergency Housing Rules (2652)



Categorical Eligibility changes as of 7/1/2024

- •Is age 65 or older
- •Receives Supplemental Security Income or Social Security Disability Insurance
- •Has provided ESD a valid 201G-VR
- •Is a child 19 years of age or younger
- •Is pregnant (any trimester)
- •Has experienced the death of a spouse, domestic partner, or minor child that caused the household to lose its housing
- •Has experienced a natural disaster, such as a flood, fire, or hurricane
- •Is under a court-ordered eviction or constructive eviction due to circumstances over which the household has no control
- •Is experiencing domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking, hate violence, or other dangerous or life-threatening conditions that relate to violence against the individual or a household member that caused the household to lose its housing

- Must meet categorical eligibility, no relaxed eligibility
